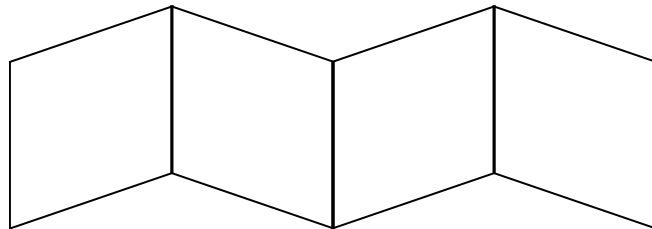


# Flow Map Foldable

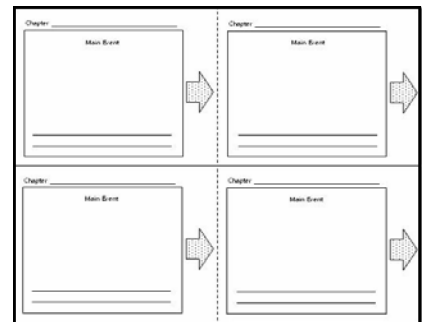
## Overview

This foldable can be created from plain paper or a variety of patterns. It's used for sequencing events, such as creating a time line or describing the plot of a story. To create the foldable without a pattern, just take an 8½" by 11" sheet of paper and cut it in half the long way to create 2 long strips of paper. Fold each paper in half and the tape them together with the edges touching but not overlapping (see example). Then write one event on each section of the foldable.



## Main Event Foldable

- Duplicate the Main Event Foldable pattern for each student. Each page provides room for 4 events or chapters in the book, so plan to have extras on hand for students who are reading long books.
- Give each student one blackline master and have them cut it in half on the solid line across the middle forming 2 long strips. Then have them fold each section on the dotted lines. Finally, ask them to place the edges of both sections together without overlapping and fasten them with a small piece of clear tape.



- To store the foldable, fold it accordion style to create a small packet.
- Have students label and decorate their foldables. They can write the title and author of the book on the front and their own names on the back.
- Students complete the inside by sketching an illustration on each section as they read. Then ask them to write a short caption to describe the main event in each chapter.
